



MEMORIAL MOTORCYCLE RUN

RIDE TO REMEMBER THIS SATURDAY, APRIL 22

Motorcycle riders will pay tribute to those impacted by the Oklahoma City bombing this Saturday morning, as they *Ride to Remember*. The **10th Annual Memorial Motorcycle Run** fundraiser for the **Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum** draws riders from across the country and includes many first responders who worked the scene of the bombing in 1995.

The Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum is owned and operated by the Oklahoma City National Memorial Foundation and does not receive any annual Federal, State or City funding.

Great photo and video opportunities as thousands of riders attempt to break the *Guinness World Record* for the most participants in a benefit motorcycle ride. The current record is 1,494 participants. This is the second attempt – last year, participation fell just short of the record.

Motorcycles will leave Harley Davidson World and Papa's Leather Barn about noon. The first stop is a wreath lay at the Oklahoma City National Memorial.
